# Journey ideas along the line...

## Pickering to Whitby Itinerary

Beat the crowds and head to Whitby, by taking our 09.00 departure from Pickering arriving in the seaside town at 10.35. You will be able to spend a good three hours enjoying the best fish and chips in Yorkshire, walking along the sandy beaches and treating yourself to an ice-cream. Returning on the 14.00 train, will transport you back to Pickering at 15.40, with time to spare in town visiting the many shops and attractions in this historic market town.

## Day Rover Itinerary

With the Whitby/Pickering Day Rover, take the 11.00 train from Pickering to Goathland where you will have the chance to look around the pretty village and station before hopping aboard the 12.50 *Yorkshire Coast Express* onto Whitby. Enjoy an afternoon of seaside fun, before returning on the 17.30 train back to Pickering (18.00 on the Gold timetable).

## Heartbeat and Hogsmeade Itinerary

Take *The Moors Explorer* from Whitby at 11.00 for a trip along the estuary of the Esk Valley and up to the moorland village of Goathland, well known as Aidsensfield in ITV's *Heartbeat* and as Hogsmeade Station in the Harry Potter films. Browse the shops or embark on a walk in the country to the Mallyan Spout Waterfall, or down the old rail trail to Grosmont, before returning to Whitby in the late afternoon.

## Whitby to the Moors Itinerary

Join *The Moors Explorer* departure at 11.00 for a journey through the heart of the North York Moors National Park including the spectacular glacial valley of Newton Dale, to the historic market town of Pickering. Returning to Whitby in the late afternoon. On green and red timetables, passengers change at Grosmont.

1st Class Service is available on some trains, at a supplement of £3.50 per person per single journey payable to the guard or ticket inspector.

Dogs are welcome on all our trains except in dining coaches, and bicycles can be carried as long as there's enough space for them. Tickets are £2.50 each, per bike or per dog.

Fares may be subject to variation during special events.



# Accessibility and Facilities

We are able to take both pushchairs and wheelchairs on our trains. A dedicated coach is also available on some services. Just let us know what kind of help you need.

When trains are in or are closely approaching Goathland it is only possible to change platforms via the footbridge. Please allow ten minutes before the train is due to depart if you need to use the level route to get to the platform for Levisham and Pickering trains.

There are public toilets at all our stations. Pickering, Goathland and Grosmont station provide accessible toilets for disabled. All stations, apart from Levisham, have baby-changing facilities.

# Car parking

Parking is available at all our stations except Newtondale Halt. Early arrival is recommended at Pickering due to limited space, although we now have an overspill car park at Trout Farm, which is signposted from the main car park. Charges apply.



## Grosmont, YO22 5QE

Our 1952 style British Railways station, Grosmont is home to the engine sheds where our locomotives are maintained and restored. It is partly funded by proceeds from the Shed Shop. It is also the junction with the main rail network, and home to one of our traditional tea rooms serving scrumptious Yorkshire fayre.



## Whitby, YO21 1YN

The perfect family day out awaits you at Whitby. Explore the stunning coastline, and its many attractions not to mention fantastic fish and chips. Even more services running in 2012.



## Goathland, YO22 5NF

Our celebrity station is home to the bewitching Hogsmeade station from the first Harry Potter film and as Aidsensfield in the beloved ITV programme *Heartbeat*. Visit the charming village of Goathland Just a few minutes' walk from the station or enjoy a cup of tea in the converted 1922 style goods shed.



## Newtondale Halt

Deep in the North York Moors National Park lies the station Newtondale Halt. By placing a special request to the guard you can stop off at this picturesque halt. It is the perfect place to start your walk or cycle ride and spot some magnificent wildlife.

## Levisham, YO18 7AJ

## Pickering, YO18 7AJ

The perfect start to your steam train adventure, view the magnificently re-instated roof originally built in 1847 by GT Andrews. The station is decorated in 1930s style and is home to one of our traditional tea rooms, serving tasty meals and snacks.



## Levisham, YO18 7NN

Accessible by one solitary hill road and surrounded by the magnificent Yorkshire Moors, Levisham is our 1912 style station. It is also home to our 'Artist in Residence' whose studio is open whenever the trains run.
